# **Editor's Notes**

# Jim & Mary Fellure

When I first came with Victory Baptist Press back in 1991 I had no idea how much God was going to bless this ministry. If you were to visit these facilities you might not be impressed with the outward appearance. Our buildings are not elaborate and we certainly don't have an over abundance of space and unless you saw the record of the scripture booklets that is actually being printed and shipped to the mission field, the mission money that is being given through Victory Baptist Church, the mission trips to Mexico several times each year and the works that are being helped in that country you might not think God is doing much with us, but may I humbly report with the hymn writer that Little Is Much When God Is In It.

## Mexico Churches

It was my privilege to take seven different trips into Mexico in 2001. On the last trip we took the bus up to Fort Oglethorpe, Georgia and picked up Pastor Chuck Starr and several of his people from the Tri-County Baptist Temple. We arrived on the border at Pharr, Texas on Monday evening, October 29 and for the next three days we saw God bless in a marvelous way. We had services all three nights in the new Iglesia Bautista Victoria (Victory Baptist Church) of Anahuac. That's the new church that our home church helped start back in March of 2001. The church had been meeting on the vacant lot all summer long but just two weeks before we arrived Pastor Jerry Hooper hand delivered \$10,000 to Brother Jose Gomez that our home church had raised to help put up a building. By the time we arrived, in that short two weeks time, they had already put down the foundation and built the walls for the new church. The building was full all three

nights, four people were saved on Tuesday, five young men surrendered to preach on Wednesday and on Thursday there were fifteen converts baptized in the Rio Grande river. At the close of the Thursday night service a visiting, middle age lady came by and told Brother Gomez that this was the first time she had been in a church in her entire life. She is thrilled that there is now a church in her community. Our wonderful Lord has certainly been good and gracious to us in letting us be involved in such a wonderful ministry.

# Scriptures Ready or Uganda

We presently have about 300,000 John/ Romans booklets and over 12,000 New Testaments printed and ready to ship to Missionary Keith Stensaas of Masaka, Uganda, East Africa. I recently went to a Christian book store and priced some booklets the size of our 64 page John/Romans. The first booklet I picked up was 62 pages and just a little smaller than our booklets. It was priced at \$2.99. The second one I looked at was 64 pages and was priced at \$2.98. The third one was less than 50 pages and was priced at \$3.98. If we took the low end, \$3.00 per booklet and charged that for our booklets, this one shipment going to Uganda would be worth \$936,000.00. Can you imagine almost a million dollars worth of scriptures going to the missionary free of charge. VBP will actually have about \$80,000 in this shipment and the missionary will get to keep the container they are shipped in for storage.

very hard to come by as it is very expensive. Our people's average monthly income is about 80,000/= Ugandan Shillings per month. (about \$47) A Bible in Lugandan, the local tribe dialect

Dear Friends and Supporters,

What a privilege it is to be able to serve the Lord another year! The News media made a lot of hype about Y2K, and nothing happened, and in 2001 it seemed like the world was turned upside down by a few terrorists. As we see events continue to unfold as a result from those attacks, we are reminded of the importance of our job here in the print shop. The word of God has all the answers, if only people would read and obey it. I understand that not everybody who reads it will obey it, but the vast majority of the people do not even have the opportunity to choose to obey because they have never had the opportunity to read the precious words of God. Last year we were able to allow a few more people to obey by providing at least a portion of the word of God to them. To be exact as I know how, we shipped out a total of 218,292 portions of scripture. There were 93,561 English John/ Romans, 2,674 English New Testaments, 13,910 Spanish John/Romans, 7,147 English Proverbs, and 101,000 French/Creol John/ Romans. The numbers would have been considerably higher last year, except we had a few setbacks. In our last News Letter I mentioned that, among other things, we were having the rollers recovered for our big web press, well, they were about a month late getting back to us, and when we got them we discovered that the company did not do everything they were supposed to and had to send the rollers back. Had they arrived on schedule, we would have had at least another 350,000 Spanish John/Romans out the door with the help of some men from Seedline International in Clayton, Indiana. Also, we have over 350,000 English John/Romans finished and in the barn waiting to be shipped to Uganda. See page 2 for more details on that.

As far as 2002 is concerned, we look

forward to staying busy for the Lord. We have two truckloads of paper in the shop right now. One whole load will be printed in Spanish, Bro. Davidson will take them to Seedline International in Indiana, put them together and ship them to Bro. Ray Bowie in Arizona who will then pass them out and distribute them to other missionaries from all over Central America. I am not sure vet if we will print the other load all in English or not, but we have an urgent need that needs to be met in Zambia for scriptures. Some missionaries there requested some back in the Spring of 2001, but we have not been able to meet their need yet.

Then we plan to print at least one truckload of New Testaments in several languages. We have had Portuguese ready to go for some time now, but have not had the time to print it. We also want to print more English and Spanish New Testaments as well. If all goes well, we should also be printing some Tagalog New Testaments.

Another job that we have had in the works for some time now is a whole Spanish Bible. As we have said before, it is quite lengthy, 45 signatures, and will be quite a thick book, unless we are able to run some thinner paper than we have up to this point. There are some technical difficulties involved that I will not bore you with at this time. Just pray that if it is the Lord's will, that He will show us the way.

It seems that every January I have a to do list for the year that never gets all the way done, I know it did not get done last year, but I am happy in the service of the Lord, what ever He has for me to do. I trust that you have found His will for your life, and are doing it to the best of your ability. There is no better way to live!



She said, "Now, where are your mittens?"


He said, "I stuffed them in the toes of my boots..."

One man in prison in Mexico has been hiding there since 1981. He told me he has been in drugs for many years. He is a cocaine addict. He has been in prisons in the United States of America several times. He said that he has several false passports. I thought that this man might be on the America's ten most wanted list. So I contacted the Drug Enforcement Administration. Thev. in turn,

checked with the F.B.I. They, in turn, said that the man was no longer wanted and has not been wanted for several years. So now, Alberto Lopez is a free man and the books are closed on him as a dead man. His family has not known of any whereabouts of him for twenty years. He hopes his wife got a divorce and he is sure his parents have died. He has remarried and now has another wife

up north. He has a son wnom ne would now love to see. He is hoping his son will talk to him. After I have him the information that he was no longer wanted by the F.B.I.

He was so excited and happy. He said that the past twenty years have been awful hiding in Mexico. I witnessed to him and God is dealing with him. Please pray that I will be able to lead him to Christ. He said that all of his friends are dead.

Please pray; our literature distribution is moving very slowly since September 11th. Some of the missionaries have slowed down taking John/Romans across the border because of trouble. At some borders our van is checked-looking for terrorists coming to the United States. Please pray that we soon will be receiving bright covers on our literature. Please continue to pray for our safety in traveling in Mexico and for souls to be saved.

(which is a very poorly translated Bible from the Revised Standard Version) cost 12.000/=Shillings (about \$7) That works out to be about 15% of their monthly income to buy a Bible with thousands of mistakes in it. That would be the equivalent of a person in America making let's say \$3,000 per month having to pay \$450 for a Bible. When I went to the Ugandan Bible Society to inquire about why they continue to sell a Bible with so many errors, they replied, "We know it has many errors, but if we stop selling it then we will not have enough money to continue our business." The English KJV Bibles here are even more costly because they have to be imported from England. In recent years we have been able to raise some money for these English Bibles but because of their cost we are only able to give them to our Bible Institute students or those that have proven that they are serious about serving the Lord. To be able to give a New Testament to someone in the church who

has just gotten saved would be such a blessing to us and to them. The John/ Romans we use for evangelism and for giving to all of our first time visitors in the church in order that they may have the gospel clearly presented. I remind our people that they are living in a country where they are truly blessed to have English as their official language in order that they might have the opportunity to have and read the pure, unadulterated Word of God. So many countries only have their translated versions that are sadly lacking. The need is not only where we are but all over Uganda, where we hope to share your blessing to us with them. Any help given to us in this project will be greatly appreciated not only by the missionaries who give them out but more importantly by the Ugandans who receive them.



# The Religion Racket

One cannot read the Gospels without being aware of the conflict between Christ and religion. He deliberately exposed the sham and hypocrisy of the established religion and warned against its deadly, smothering effect. He knew it had to be swept away before the reality of the truth that He brought could be felt.

In our generation, religion again finds itself encrusted with the same kind of accumulation and the desperate need is to again expose this condition and destroy it so that the truth might again shine forth. Religion today bears the same characteristics that Jesus so vigorously condemned. Practically every place where religion is supposed to exert an influence it is being defeated.

However, most religion goes right on making the colossal pretense that all is well and that religion is marching victoriously onward and upward. This refusal to admit failure and the insistence upon keeping up the pretense of success has produced a religion that is a deliberate deception.

The tragedy is that real religion is buried under the maze of contradicting claims, tired traditions, and deliberate deceits of this racket in religion. It has cloaked itself in superficial sanctity and hides from honest appraisal. It is time to bring today's religion out into a full investigation of its reality . . . not its pretense.

Contrast real religion with the current crop of counterfeits and we will find nothing more than shallow substitutes. Are we willing to refuse the substitute and to demand the real thing? Are we ready to discard our sacred shams and pompous pretenses? Are we ready to be honest about religion?

The sham condition of religion in Jesus' day had to be exposed and destroyed before Christianity could be born. It will again have to be exposed and destroyed if Christianity is to be reborn in our generation.

# **Hudson Taylor**

1832 - 1905

# A biographical sketch of the man and his ministry

The great missionary to China, James Hudson Taylor, was born in Barnsley, England, in the year 1832. He came from a Christian home, his father being a Methodist preacher, but Huudson chose to live for the world until a praying mother and a gospel tract brought him to Christ at the age of seventeen

In 1849, he became very unhappy with his spiritual state and decided to start preparing to go China as a missionary. He moved to a low income area and forced upon himself numerous hardships in order to better acquaint himself with the kind of life he would have in China. He saw first hand that God is able to care for and bless those who put Him first.

After some medical training in London, Taylor left for China under the Chinese Evangelization Society in September of 1853. He arrived at Shanghai, after a very rough voyage, on March 1,1854. At first he settled in Shaghai, but civil war soon forced him to move to the International Setttlement where other foreigners lived.

He began making preaching trips, sometimes alone, and sometimes with other missionaries. In 1855, he traveled to many villages preaching, distributing books and providing medical care. He also did some work on the island of Tsungming, but was forbidden to return there because his medical service was causing a loss of business for local physicians. Taylor and Scottish evangelist William Burns traveled about 1,000 miles south of Shanghai and ministered at Swaton for a few months in 1856, but the door there was soon closed.

He was robbed the same year as he traveled to settle in Ningpo, losing his travel bed, some clothes, two watches, a Bible his mother had given him, and some surgical instruments. To make matters worse, his mission board stopped sending him funds. He resigned the mission board in late 1856 and kept preaching the word.

In January of 1859, Hudson Taylor married Maria Dyer, a twenty-one year old helper to Mary Ann Aldersey, an English missionary. They had a very happy marriage together, and God gave them several children

With Hudson having health problems, the family took a furlough back to England in

1860. While on furlough, Hudson translated the Ningpo New Testament, and wrote the book, *China: It's Spiritual Needs and Claims* (1865).

He established the China Inland Mission in 1865 and began praying for God to give him twenty-four missionaries to take back to China. Within a year God gave him his twenty-four volunteers and \$13,000. In December of 1865, the Taylors lost a child in a premature birth and Maria's lungs were permanently damaged.

The Taylors and sixteen of the volunteers set out for China in May of 1866. After enduring a typhoon in the South China Sea, they were towed on in by a steam tug in September. Due to overcrowding at the Ningpo Mission site, they decided to move on to Yangchow in December. An eight year old daughter (Gracie) died in 1867. By the end of July, 1868, they had reached Yangchow and set up their own compound. However, they were beaten and robbed a few weeks later, and their compound was burned to the ground. Some of the missionaries were severely injured, including Maria, who could not walk without help. This turned out to be a spiritual turning point for Hudson, where he vowed to trust God and abide in Christ rather than labor in his own strength. They settled in Chinkiang for several weeks and then returned to Yangchow in November.

In February of 1870, the Taylorsmade the tough decision to send four of their five children back to England, keeping only baby Charles with them. Five year old Samuel then died on February 4th. Finally, on March 22nd, three children (Bertie, Freddie, and Maria) were sent back to England in tears with Emily Blatchley who would care for them.

Another child was born in July (Noel), but he died after only thirteen days. Only three days later (July 23rd), Maria herself died of tuberculosis. She was thirty-three, and had given birth to eight living children and one stillborn.

Health problems and ministry needs back home caused Hudson to return to England in 1871. He met and married a Miss Faulding the same year. The following year (1872) he formed the London Council of the China Inland Mission and then returned to China with his new bride.

In 1874, Hudson's faith in God brought

in \$4000 for work in new provinces, and he also opened up a western branch of the mission in Wuchang with another missionary.

Miss Blatchley then died back in England, so Hudson and his wife had to hurry home to the children. During this trip he seriously injured himself and spent the next few months paralyzed in bed. God then restored his health, and he left for China again. This time, he went alone, leaving his wife in England to care for six children (three from the previous marriage, two from the current marriage and one adopted daughter).

Political changes opened new doors in China, so Hudson spent the next two years (1876-1878) traveling 30,000 miles opening new mission stations. His wife rejoined him in 1878. By 1887, fifty-nine churches had been established with over 1,600 members. In 1887 alone, God gave him over \$100,000 for the work and 102 new missionaries.


Health problems forced him to return home soon. He and his wife ended up semi-retired in Switzerland. Then the Boxer Rebellion broke out in China which led to the murder or expulsion of hundreds of missionaries and native Christians. His wife then died in 1904.

In 1905, Hudson Taylor returned to China one last time. After making several visits and inspecting a site for a new hospital in Changsha, he died on June 3rd and was buried next to Maria near the Yangtze River

### Job And His Mediator

Job 9:1-2; 25:4-6

There are two great questions asked in the book of Job: "Why do the righteous suffer?" and "How can a man be justified?" The second question does not receive as much notice as the first, but it is a major concern in this book. I believe that the first question has always haunted man – there is a natural desire in man to be in fellowship with his Creator.

However, there are two great facts that keep man from being just with God: the sinfulness of man and the holiness of God. Man's condition and God's character are the two stumbling blocks to a right relationship with God.

The Depravity of Man. Job describes man as abominable and filthy and one who drinks water like iniquity. Sinful and depraved describes the natural man better than any word in the dictionary – the human race is more depraved than it is anything else.

The Holiness of God. The very essence of God is holiness. All man wants to recognize is God's love, but the bible emphasizes the holiness of God more than it does His love.

Now when you put these two facts together – that man is sinful and God is holy – it creates a problem. The question that is put forth in the book of Job is: "How can man that is sinful be just with God?" How can sinful man and holy God get together?

Now the devil knows this is a problem and so he endeavors to give man the wrong answer to the right question. The devil knows that, sooner or later, every man is going to ask this question and search for the answer – so he has devised some answers that prevent man from learning the

truth. As long as the devil can have you believe a lie – any lie – it will keep your blinded to the truth.

In the book of Job, three men step forward with their idea of what it takes to be right with God. As you consider their answers, you should recognize that all three are lies straight out of the devil's mouth.

# 1.) Satanic Revelations!

Job 4:12-16. The first man to step up is Eliphaz. He has received a revelation in the night and he wants to tell Job what it said. What he describes is an experience that took place while he was sleeping one night. He awoke to find a mysterious presence in his room. A spirit was in his room and it speaks to him (4:17-21).

Now what did Eliphaz see and who did he hear talking to him in the middle of the night? Maybe he just had a bad dream or is making the whole thing up – but I am going to take it at face value: Eliphaz received a visitor from another world one night and it told him how to be just with God.

Now it certainly was not God or an angel that he spoke to because later God would tell all three friends of Job that they had not spoken that which is right. I believe that Eliphaz had an experience with a demonic spirit that gave him advice to give to Job. Remember that it is Satan himself that is intimately concerned with making Job curse God and Satan does have demons that do his bidding (I John 4:1; I Tim. 4:1). The devil is filling men's minds with answers to their questions – but the answers are wrong answers.

# 2.) Sophisticated Reasoning!

Job 8:8-10. The next man to step up is Bildad. He thinks he has the answer to the question but he is no closer to the truth than was Eliphaz. What Bildad tells Job to do is go to the library and blow the dust off of some of those books of history and philosophy and study the accumulated wisdom of the ages. See what the great philosophers and great thinkers have had to say.

That lie has worked so well for the devil that he is still using it. Mankind thinks he is smart enough to think his way out of his problems. He would rather listen to what some other man has said than what God has said. Soceity is in the sad shape it is in because of the philosophies of such men as Darwin, Marx, Freud, Dewey - their philoso-

phies have influenced our nation and we are worse off because of it. The accumulated wisdom of these men and others has sabotaged the bible, humanized God, deified man, minimized sin and glorified greed.

# 3.) Sterile Ritualism!

Job 11:13-15. Zophar is the third man to step up with advice and he thinks he has the answer to Job's problem. What Zophar recommends is reformation. It is the religion of self-effort – the doctrine of do a little more and try a little harder.

There are millions of America who are devoutly religious, but it is a religion of works. They are trudging to church Sunday after Sunday and going through a ritual, trying to turn over a new leaf and put away sin somehow, seeing what they can do to reform their lives. They have put their finger on the problem, but they have not found the answer. They have a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof.

### So What Is The Answer?

**9:1-2.** Job has received three answers but none of them has satisfied his seeking heart. Job was sincere in his desire and none of the answers given him rang true with him. His heart is still crying out.

9:32-33. Job recognizes the real problem. He knows there is a great gulf between him and God and how can it be bridged. How can a man get to God? The word, "daysman" is an old word for mediator. It is someone who stands between two parties and mediates. Someone who can represent the interests of both parties and be impartial to both. What is needed is someone who knows what it is like to be God and man.

But who could we send from our side that understands what it is like to be God and, yet sympathize with the demands of the Almighty? And who is there in the heavens that can also understand what it is like to be man and sympathize with the needs of humanity? There is no angel – not even the seraphims and cherubims that could bridge the gap for they are neither deity or humanity.

There is only One who knows what it is like to be God and One who knows what it is like to be man. There is One who can mediate between the king and the beggar – the Sovereign and the sinner – this world and the other world – the Creator and the creature. "There is one mediator between God and men; the man, Christ Jesus."
