

Editor's Notes

This is Monday, October 30th, and I am writing these notes from my home in Milton, Florida. We have turned the spare room at our house into an office, and it is certainly a much more convenient place to work, especially early in the morning.

ONE MILLION DOLLARS RAISED FOR MISSIONS

The meetings since our last Newsletter have been wonderful, and I wish I could report on them all, but space won't allow it. I deeply appreciate every pastor that has used us in any kind of meeting, but I especially enjoy the mission conferences. In the month of October alone, I took part in five different mission conferences and saw more than a million dollars promised for world-wide missions within the next year. Our home church, Victory Baptist here in Florida, ended their annual Faith Promise Conference yesterday. Last year the church gave \$255,000 to missions, and the new commitment taken yesterday went up to \$270,000 for the next year. To God be the glory!

MISSION TRIP TO PACHUCA, MEXICO

The highlight for the month of September was a trip to Pachuca, Mexico, to preach for missionary Adam Thompson. Pachuca is a city of 700,000 people about an hour north of Mexico City. There are only two gospel preaching Baptist churches in the city, and Brother Adam started one of them sixyears ago. They have close to two hundred

people (They have personally won most of them to Christ.) meeting in a rented facility until they can finish a building on their own property. They have the foundation down and the pillars up, but they are temporarily out of building money. Just as soon as they get in their own building, they plan to take what they are spending on rent and start another church in a city of about 40,000 one hour east of Pachuca with no gospel preaching church at all.

I just happened to be in Pachuca on September 15 which is Mexico's Independence Day. We went to the big celebration downtown that night, and I have never seen as many people in one place in my life. Brother Adam is having a Mexico patriotic cover designed with their church information for a Spanish John/Romans, and Victory Baptist Press plans to print 50,000 copies to be distributed during the big celebration next year.

For several years Brother Humberto Gomez has worked at perfecting the Reina Valera Spanish Bible. Through the testimony of many Spanish speaking people, we are convinced it is by far the closest thing to a King James Bible in Spanish in print today. We have already printed several thousand of the New Testaments and will soon be printing the entire Bible. Brother Humberto is a very humble, generous, dedicated man of God. He has given hundreds of the hardback and also leather bound Bibles away, and I know personally that he borrowed several thousand dollars to have them printed at a commercial printer. He has worked hard at paying off the loans and is now in the process of raising the funds for another printing. With Hispanics being the largest minority group in America, we would even be doing our country a great service by supporting the RVG 2004 Bible printing.

Mission Attrition

Dr. Jeff Williams, veteran missionary to New Zealand, gave the BBTI graduating class of 2006 a sad example of the attrition in our Baptist missionary force. He was one of 450 missionaries supported by a church on the east coast. Unfortunately, the church lost a number of members and could not continue supporting that many missionaries. They vowed not to drop any missionaries but not to take on any new ones. At the end of four years, the number of their missionaries still on the field had decreased to 280! One hundred and seventy missionary families, or almost 38% of their missionary force, left the field in only four years! Perhaps a few died or retired, but the vast majority left for other reasons.

At a time when the world population is increasing rapidly, making the need for missionaries even greater, the number of missionaries going to meet that challenge is decreasing. Furthermore, many missionaries drop out after only a year or two. Some stay for four years, take a furlough, and then do not return for a second term.

Veteran missionary to Japan, Kenneth Mansell, says that in many countries the number of missionaries returning for a second term is as low as 10%! How many of those missionary families planned to stay only one term or less? On deputation, did they tell the churches that they would need support for only twenty-four or thirty-six months? No, they planned to spend a lifetime on the field! Therefore, we conclude that something went wrong! Could it have been prevented? Was it God's plan for them to spend three or four years visiting churches to raise their support, spend thousands of dollars on passage to the field, then thousands more to set up housekeeping, buy a vehicle, and go to a language school, etc. only to return home in such a short time? What does this do to church members who pray and make financial sacrifices to help send these missionaries? It must be heartbreaking for the missionaries themselves who must live with the fact that they left their field before they planned to. The important

question, however, is where does it leave the heathen that never hear the Gospel of Christ because a missionary never went to them or did not stay long enough to learn their language and culture and preach Christ?

The field is a difficult place. If the Devil attacks any Christian, you know it is the one who invades his territory, the mission field! There are many diseases on the field that might cause a family to leave. (But why don't they return when they are well again or find another field where medical services are available?) When a missionary family is discouraged because of their inability to communicate well with the people, when the culture stress is great, and when the results are few, they are tempted to use one of the many "respectable" reasons for leaving the field.

Political problems, wars, inability to renew visas, and such problems sometimes force missionaries from their chosen field; but why don't they go to another country? Is the call of God a "there or nowhere" call? Is a closed door a call to go home? It wasn't for the Apostle Paul!

Many missionary casualities result from the inability to learn the native language and culture. It may be that the husband or the wife is overcome by language or culture shock. Perhaps they reason, if we cannot reach these people, what use is it for us to be here? Very few missionaries are going to admit that they dropped out because of failure, and we are not going to judge them; but we cannot help but wonder. A pastor should make it his business to find out what went wrong. His question should be, what can be done to drastically reduce this tragic rate of attrition?

Are the people being sent to the field of a poor quality and destined to fail? Should mission applicants be better screened so that the potential dropouts will be weeded out? That would reduce the number of missionaries even more; and besides, what reliable test can be used to predict whether or not they will stay on the field? Are those who leave the field prematurely less intelligent than those who stick it out? I doubt it very much. Are the casualities less spiritual than those who succeed? Probably not.

When an exceptional family is willing to give up the American dream and serve Christ on a foreign field, why not prepare them for what they are going to encounter? Are they not worthy of the very best possible preparation? Don't tell me that all they need are Bible college and language school; the ones who came home in defeat went to Bible college and language school. Don't tell me that people are dying without Christ and we cannot afford the time for specialized training. We insist missionaries take all the time needed to raise financial support, don't we? Besides, the missionary trained in linguistics and language learning will learn the new language more quickly and accurately than the one who rushes to the field without

Am I wrong in thinking that missionaries should not go to a new and difficult field without proper training in language and culture learning? Most Baptist missionaries are bypassing the one school available to them, and naively saying, "I can't fail! I am spiritual! I am called of God!" So were the ones who came home. Am I wrong, or is the pastor wrong that would send his precious missionary family to the mission field ill prepared?

Mission attrition is an undeniable reality. We cannot stop missionaries from leaving the field because of death. We have no right to demand that they not retire, but die on the field. Some are going to leave due to life-threatening illness. However, we must prevent the preventable causes of mission attrition! A missionary couple that can successfully learn the new language and adapt to the culture is naturally going to reach the people for Christ; and they will be much less likely to leave their field prematurely. The nine-month intensive training program of Baptist Bible Translators Institute prepares missionaries to succeed.

Separation Is Still In The Bible 2 Corinthians 6:14-17

Separation is not a subject that you hear much preaching on these days. What little preaching is given to the subject is often so vague that no one is sure who the preacher is talking about or where he stands on specifics. And if he does get personal he is sure to be labeled a legalist with charges that he just wants to run your life. The Bible answer, however, to all the objections to separation is, "come out from among them, and be ye separate." We, as believers, are not to be isolationists, but we are expected to live holy lives in contrast to the walk of this world.

1. Separation Insulates You From The World!

The most important reason for biblical separation is to protect you from the influence and defilement of the world. In Haggai 2 the Lord engages the priests of that day in a question and answer session. They were not taking the laws of ceremonial separation very seriously, and the Lord explained to them why those laws were in place. The first question was, in essence, can a holy thing touch a neutral thing and make it holy. The obvious answer is no. The next question was whether an unholy thing touching a neutral thing made it unholy. This time the answer is yes. If a person touched the high priestly garments he did not become holy by that contact, but if he touched a dead carcass he did become unholy. The lesson is clear: the holy does not sanctify the unholy but the unholy does corrupt the holy. Whenever you bring the holy and unholy together, the unholy always affects the holy.

If a sick person and healthy person get together do not expect the good health of the one to cure the sickness of the other. The sick person does not get healthy by being around a healthy person; rather, the healthy person will get sick. One bad apple in a bushel of good apples will not lose its rottenness by the influence of the good apples. Instead, soon all the apples will be rotten. Mix a glass of clean water and a glass of dirty water and you will have a glass of dirty water. The dirty water is not purified by mixing with the clean water; the clean water is defiled by mixing with the dirty.

"Evil communications corrupt good manners." Good never makes evil better; evil always defiles good. The dirty pollutes the clean, the unholy corrupts the holy, the impure defiles the pure, and the ungodly perverts the godly. This is the reason why a believer should never marry an unbeliever, why you should shelter your children from the world and restrict who their friends are, why you should never send your children to a public school, why you should be careful who your golfing buddies are, why you should reevaluate your music, entertainment, friends, reading material, internet content, etc.

2. Separation Identifies You As Being Different!

"But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people;" The child of God is to be different from this world and separation is how this distinction is to be made. Of course, the desire of the compromiser of the day is to blur the lines and for all to come together for the sake of unity. But read through the book of Acts and study the testimony of the first century Christians and you will see they didn't care one whit about unity with the world.

Those who object to being different will quote their favorite verse for support: "for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the LORD looketh on the heart." They interpret this to mean that God doesn't care what the outside looks like as long as your heart is right. But this is not saying that God is not interested on the outward appearance; the point is that God is not fooled by the outward appearance. Your hypocrisy and veneer don't fool God. God is concerned

about the outward because it is a reflection of what's in the heart.

Do you now how to tell the difference between a Christian and the world? The same way you tell the difference between a horse and a cow. They look different, they make different noises, and they hang around others of their own kind. If you see an animal that looks like a cow, moos a lot, and hangs around other known cows there is a strong chance that it is a cow. If you see a creature that looks just like this world, sounds just like them, and hangs around them all the time there is a strong chance they are of the world. You can tell what branch of military a man is in by the uniform he wears. You can tell a police officer by the uniform he wears. You can tell who is the opposing team on the football field by the uniform he wears. Sadly, too many Christians want to wear the uniform of the opposing team.

3. Separation Instills A Dynamic For Duty!

The first century church was so effective because their testimony validated their message. The world saw the power of the Gospel working in their lives. The gospel message coming from a worldly Christian is a distorted message with an uncertain sound. We must have a clear message and a clean life; the walk must match the talk if we are to have any power in our service for God.

When Lot tried to persuade his sonsin-law to leave Sodom, "he seemed as one that mocked" to them. He was telling them how wicked Sodom was but they knew his lifestyle. Worldly Lot was trying to make a case against worldliness and they weren't buying it. I wonder how many in our churches have the right message, but they seem as one that mocks because of their dress, their music, their friends, their language, etc. The mantra that you have to join them to win them has never worked and never will. If I find a man in quicksand I don't need to jump in with him to help him out. In fact, if I do jump in with him, I won't be able to help him out. Only by staying out of the same pit he is in can I possibly be of any assistance to him. The world doesn't need me to conform to them; they need me to show them a better way.
