When I am on the road in meetings, I seem to forget just how much work goes into producing a book. Brother Al Berg and Brother Mark Yorey take care of typesetting, layout, film-making, plate-making, printing, binding, trimming, boxing, shipping, and the maintenance of all the equipment and the building. They also put up with constant interruptions from me, going in and out of the shop, and asking questions to see if we can do a better job on any of the printing. The men do an excellent job at printing a quality product, but we are always looking for places for improvement. The Lord gave us a perfect Book, and we believe we should try to reproduce it just as perfect as possible. Our Lord is worthy of the very best we can possibly do.

I have also enjoyed several of Mary's home-cooked meals of fresh vegetables. Tim and my two eleven-year-old grandsons, Jacob and Nathan, have a garden in our back- yard, and it has produced potatoes, green beans, squash, cucumbers, collards, broccoli, tomatoes, watermelon, corn, eggplant, radishes, carrots, cabbage, canteloupe, and three kinds of peppers. There are more coming on, but I will soon be back on the road in meetings and miss some of the organically, homegrown vegetables, but that's okay, because as Brother Jack Wood once said, "I would rather preach than eat."

While I was preaching for Pastor Jim Taylor in May in San Antonio, Texas, at their

annual meeting, he gave me a copy of an old, out-of-print book, *Plain Papers On The Doctrine Of The Holy Spirit*, written in 1899, by C. I. Scofield. I immediately read the book and knew that it must be reprinted. After checking to make sure the copyright had expired, I set the type and format and had it ready for Sister Heidi Berg to proofread when I got home. The book is now being printed. To order a copy of this excellent book, look on page seven of this Newsletter.

Missionary Keith Stensas, serving in Unganda, East Africa, tells us that the only Bible in Luganda (the native language) is copyrighted by the Uganda Bible Society and was translated from the English Revised Standard Version; and it was poorly translated at that. Even if it was a reliable translation, the average Ugandan could not own one. The cost is two and a half days' pay for the average Unganda worker. Because of the translation and the cost, there has never been a mass distribution of Scriptures in that country. Brother Stensas and some other good, fundamental, Baptist missionaries, have finished translating the Gospel of John, and Victory Baptist Press has it ready to print. Our only hold up is the \$50,000 it will take to complete the project. The truckload of paper will cost between \$18,000 and \$20,000

dollars. The cover stock will be about another \$18,000. The shipping fee alone will be about \$10,000, plus all the other supplies and the time it will take to complete the project, so a \$50,000 total is a conservative figure.

Dear Friends and Supporters,

The past few months have had us busy tying up some loose ends in the shop and getting ready for some big things to happen in the not too distant future. There are three big projects coming up, and I am not sure which will come first: 1) **The whole Spanish Bible**. We have talked about this for a long time, and have made several attempts at it, but now we are closer than ever to making it happen. 2) **A truckload of Lugandan Gospels of John**. See the

editor's notes for more info on that project.

3) **Building and moving into a new print shop**. Please pray about all of these projects.

In Genesis 2:8 the Bible says, "And the LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed." It was God's original intent for man to be a gardener. If you have never tried to coax a plant out of the ground, you will probably not understand some of the things I am about to write about, but the other day I was pulling weeds from my garden and meditating about some of the things of God. These are some of my "garden gleanings."

- 1. The field is the world and *something* is going to grow in that field. I am told even the dry desert sand of the Sahara has viable seed in it that will sprout and grow when the rare rainfall does occur in that region. Genesis 2:15 says that man's job in the garden was to dress and keep it. While something will grow just about anywhere, it is man's job to make grow what is profitable and desirable.
- 2. Homegrown fruits and vegetables are always better than store-bought ones.
- 3. Imperfect fruit is often more acceptable when grown in your own garden, than perfect fruit bought from the market.
  - 4. If given a choice, and money is no

object, organic or naturally grown fruit is always preferred over fruit grown with chemical fertilizers, pesticides, and herbicides.

- 5. Some weeds are more harmful than others.
- 6. One man's weeds are another man's treasure. A lot of people spend a lot of money and time ridding their yard of dandelions while others order those seeds from seed catalogues.
- 7. Some weeds, if allowed to remain, attract beneficial insects that eat the bad ones.
  - 8. Crop failure is rarely due to bad seed.
- 9. In the parable of the four types of soil in Luke 8, the sower did not throw 75% of his seed on the bad ground.

I believe all of these have some application to the ministry in general. Victory Baptist Press is interested in getting the good seed of the Word of God to sowers (missionaries) who will do their best to put it into good soil.

If you have never had part in growing a garden, most of these points will not be understood. I would encourage everyone to grow some kind of garden, no matter how large or small, in order to know God just a little bit better.



# ONE LITTLE COFFEE PLANT THAT DIDN'T QUIT

Gardening: Picking up stones, tilling the soil, marking off rows, and sowing seed, even the dirty, sweat-streaked faces and breaking backs - yes, my husband and I enjoy all of that! We know that, in a few weeks, according to the laws of nature that God set in motion and if conditions are favorable, we will soon be enjoying the well-loved "tomato sandwich" and crunching on a cool cucumber. As a gardener, I know that other than eating the produce, nothing is more satisfying than to watch the process of a single seed or plant being placed into the ground, nourished by sun and rain, only to bring forth a harvest of many fold.

In 1723, in the history of Jamaica Blue Mountain coffee, three coffee plants were sent from France to the French colony of Martinique where the plants proliferated and produced a good crop. Five years later, the governor of Jamaica received a single one of those plants as a gift. This one plant took root in the fertile soil where it was placed, and with the favorable growing conditions, a miracle took place. In only nine years, Jamaica began exporting that Blue Mountain coffee with an initial shipment of 83,000 pounds! From a single, living plant a thriving and vital coffee industry was born in Jamaica.

We see this principle of sowing and reaping clearly in the parable of the sower in Luke 8. He faithfully sowed the seed and, though some fell on hard soil or was snatched away by fowls or choked out by thorns, still some fell on good ground and with the proper growing conditions brought forth fruit an hundredfold. As the governor of Jamaica was given the single coffee plant, we have been given just such a gift in the living, viable seed of the Word of God. All over the world lie fields that are waiting to be sown, many having just the right soil and conditions to bring forth a harvest of an hundredfold! We are entrusted with a precious Seed that can only produce a harvest if it is planted. Within that Seed is the miraculous power to transform a life, to give hope to the hopeless, to assure that longing soul that there is One who loves him and wants to give him eternal life with God in heaven.

There are many printing ministries faithfully laboring to produce quantities of this life-giving Seed. Barren fields are waiting, ready to receive the Seed, where it can be tilled and worked so the sun and rain of the Holy Spirit's working can bring it to fruition. The one part of the equation still in short supply is the sowers, those who will take that precious Seed and plant it in those fields. As the planting process takes place, surely the Husbandman of glory will be satisfied to see the harvest that will be gathered in.

## Shamgar

### Judges 3:31

The book of Judges records the history of one of the saddest eras in Israel's existence. It covers a period of some three hundred years, and tells one story that is repeated seven times. The story is, that after Joshua died, the nation fell into apostasy. They forsook God and followed after the idols of their Gentile neighbors. As punishment, God allowed them to go into bondage to one of those Gentile neighbors for a number of years. Eventually, the people of Israel would repent and God would raise up a deliverer in their midst. This happened not just once, but seven times. The progression was always the same: rebellion, retribution, repentance, and restoration.

This was the period of the judges: fifteen of them in all. Fourteen men and one woman. Do not think of the judges as someone wearing a black robe in a courtroom passing down judicial decisions. These judges were not legal experts as much as they were warriors. Though they did judge Israel in matters of the law, their main role was to lead the men to war against whatever nation was oppressing them at the time.

In the first three chapters we meet the first three of these judges: The king of Mesopotamia had oppressed Israel for eight years, and Othniel was the first judge God raised up to deliver them. For forty years Israel enjoyed peace under the good leadership of Othniel. But then the Moabites came and began to terrorize the people. For eighteen long years they imposed a heavy tax upon all Israel – a tax Israel had to pay to live in their own land. In the eighteenth year a man from Benjamin named Ehud was chosen to carry the annual tax to the capital of Moab. Ehud arranged a private meeting with the king of Moab and assassinated him

with a dagger. Ehud then escaped and fled back to the country of Ephraim where he rallied an army and attacked the Moabites, giving the land rest for eighty years.

And then we come to Shamgar! Shamgar was an unexceptional man who did an exceptional thing. You won't find him in Hebrew's hall of fame, and very few sermons ever mention his name. There has probably never been a song dedicated to his memory, and no monuments have been built to his honor. The Scriptures give us only one verse to cover his entire life, but that one little verse gives us great insight into the life of an ordinary man who did extraordinary things for his people.

### 1) An Unfamiliar Figure!

What do you know about Shamgar? Where did he live? What did he do for a living? Who did he marry and did he have any children? The only detail about his life we know is that he was the son of Anath, but who was Anath? Herbert Lockyer, in *All the Men of the Bible*, lists Shamgar as the son of Anath and Anath as the father of Shamgar. Doesn't help us much, does it?

Furthermore, we can't be really sure as to what kind of judging he did. He is listed in all the lists of the judges as the third judge, but it is disputed whether he was a national judge or not. The reason I say that is because Judges 3:15-30 speaks of the acts of Ehud. There is one verse for Shamgar. Then 4:1 takes you back to the death of Ehud and continues the history from his time.

Shamgar must have lived during the time of Ehud. Perhaps Ehud was the national judge, while Shamgar was a local judge. While Ehud was fighting the Moabites on the eastern border, Shamgar was fighting the Philistines on the western coast. And while slaying six hundred of the enemy is nothing to sneeze at, it certainly is not the 10,000 who fell by the army of Ehud.

There just isn't much to say about Shamgar, and you may feel like there isn't much to say about you. Many of God's children feel their one talent is not enough to invest, and that if they can't be great, then it's not worth being anything. But God uses nobodies like Shamgar; people that no one else thinks are usable.

### 2) An Uneven Fight!

The odds are staggering: six hundred Philistines to one Shamgar. Now it does not say that Shamgar fought them all at one time. He could have, but it seems more reasonable to me that over a course of time,

he fought back six hundred men. I visualize him in the fields working when he sees a band Philistines coming in to vandalize a house. He grabs his weapon and heads them off. A fight ensues and soon there are a couple of dead Philistines and Shamgar still standing. A few days later another band comes in and Shamgar runs out to meet them. But whether these six hundred represent one battle or a number of battles, 600-1 is an uneven fight. The odds are stacked against Shamgar. He could easily slink away, and nobody would blame him. This is a suicide mission!

And perhaps God has called you to some task that seems impossible. The difficulty is overwhelming, and the commitment God has called for is unthinkable. But when you feel like the odds are too great, just remember Shamgar and his six hundred excuses not to get involved. Perhaps you are facing insurmountable problems in your home. Maybe it is that you are dealing with pressures beyond bearing or feel a calling that is beyond your ability. The odds are great, but God is greater.

#### 3) An Unthinkable Feat!

The weapon Shamgar uses is an oxgoad. An ox-goad was simply a long, stout stick with a sharp point on one end. When the oxen would go slowly or refuse to move, the ploughman would take the sharp point of the goad and jab it in the backside of the oxen to spur them on - a stick with a sharp point. I am sure Shamgar would have preferred a sword or a spear, but he didn't have one. All he had was an ox-goad. He could use only what he had, but he could use that. So Shamgar grabbed the only weapon he could find and fought the Philistines.

So we have an unfamiliar figure fighting an uneven fight with an unconventional weapon at an unsettling time. And he won! And do you know why he won? Because he started where he was, used what he had, and did what he could. He didn't have time for excuses; there were Philistines to fight. He didn't have time to talk about why it couldn't be done; he had Philistines to fight.

Now, could you let Shamgar be an example and encouragement to you? Many of God's saints have read the brief bio of this hero and have been inspired to take what was in their hand and do a work for God. If Shamgar with his ox-goad can do a mighty deed, then why can't you and I?
