Missionary Antonio Arellano and his wife Angela have a need

It has been my privilege to preach many times in Monterrey, Mexico, for missionary Antonio Arellano. I have been in services in five of the six churches and in the medical clinic Brother Antonio has started. The attendance in the churches is phenomenal and hundreds of poor, sick people have received free treatment in the clinic, after they have heard a clear presentation of the Gospel of Christ. Hundreds, and maybe even thousands, of people have been saved and had their lives changed through this ministry. I know firsthand that God has used Antonio and Angela in a marvelous way, but not without great sacrifice. During the twenty-six years of pouring their lives into others, Antonio and Angela have never owned their own home. They have lived all of these years in an upstairs apartment owned by Angela's dad, missionary Sonny Fritz

Three years ago Angela began having intense pain in her feet and knees. She tried different doctors and has been told that she

has rheumatoid arthritis The pain has worsened until she can barely make it up and down this long flight of stairs.

Two years ago Brother Antonio began building them a house so Angela wouldn't have to climb the stairs. At this time they are still \$20,000 short of the funds needed to finish the house. If they had the money, it could be completely finished within six months.

It would be a wonderful thing if some of our readers would feel some compassion toward this dear sister in the Lord and help with the needed funds to finish their house so she could live on ground level. I have never heard Antonio or Angela complain, but I have heard them say many times that, "God has been so good to us." They didn't ask me to raise money for their need, but I feel impressed of the Lord to plead with our Christian friends to please help. The Print Shop

Dear Friends and Supporters,

The new year is upon us and I hope you have not already broken all your new resolutions. I have solved that problem by never making any. It is not that I never try to better myself, it just seems foolish to wait until New Year's Day to do it. Whatever your plan is, I hope it works for you and that you will be found serving the Lord until Jesus comes.

Things are coming along well for the Spanish Bible. It is completely printed, except for the covers. We have been collating it in sections on our collating machine. There are eleven pockets plus a hand feeding station. The entire Bible has


thirty-four signatures which must be put together, so we printed the first eleven signatures, then collated them, stacking them on pallets. Then the same with the second set of eleven and now we are doing the last twelve signatures, utilizing the hand feeding station. Then these three stacks of signatures will need to be collated by hand and put through the glue binder to get a cover put on. After that, the three edges will need to be trimmed. As you can see, there is a lot more to making a book than just the printing. (There is all the pre-press work as well.) Much of the work is tedious and monotonous, and we get tired in doing it, but not tired of doing it. There are only two full-time, paid workers in our shop, but we have had many volunteers. One in particular is worth mentioning, a gentleman named Troy Hardy. Bro. Hardy has been around the block a few times, as they say. He actually goes way back to the beginning of Victory Baptist Church as the first song leader under Bro. Woodward. He has since moved away and in recent years spent a lot of time helping missionaries and nationals in Mexico. When he found out we were going to print the Spanish Bible, he wanted to get some to bring to Mexico and has volunteered almost from

the time we started printing until now. He has been a faithful worker here in the shop for over two months now and wants nothing in return except some Bibles to take to Mexico. We would not be nearly as far along in this project without his help. We thank God for his help and for everyone else that has made it possible to do this work by way of your giving and prayers. By the grace of God there will be over 20,000 people that will receive a copy of the Word of God from this truckload of paper (not to mention the 8,000 Russian New Testaments we printed earlier).

The new print shop is ready to move into. I am sure I will have my hand in it, but Bro. Richburg will be doing a lot of that work while we finish binding these Bibles. Pray for all of us as we make the transition. The big press alone weighs about 38,000 pounds, not something that you want dropped on your toes. Please pray that once we get moved in, God will provide the paper and other materials needed to keep on printing God's Word.




it up as the same old rhetoric. Make a change.

Simon the Sorcerer

Acts 8:9-24

In Acts 8 there are two conversions recorded under the preaching of Philip the evangelist: one true and one false. There is no doubt the Ethiopian eunuch was sincere in his seeking the truth, he understood who Jesus Christ was, and was saved. Simon the sorcerer, on the other hand, had a religious experience but never was truly converted. He believed, made a profession of faith, was baptized, continued for a while – but he died and went to hell.

From all outward appearances, it looked like Simon was a genuine convert. In Acts 8:13 he did three things: believed, was baptized, and continued. That sounds about like what we want all new converts to do. It sounds like he's about ready to teach the junior boys' Sunday School class. But a careful reading of the text will expose Simon as a religious hypocrite who never knew true saving grace. The problem with Simon was that he had a faulty theology. When you read the text you will see exactly what Simon believed in his heart. And for all his profession of faith and baptism, what he believed in his heart kept him from having a true conversion.

1) An Egotistical View of Self!

8:9 – "But there was a certain man, called Simon, which beforetime in the same city used sorcery, and bewitched the people of Samaria, giving out that himself was some great one:" This is what Simon thought about himself He thought he was great, and everyone who knew him thought he was a great person. And when he came to God, it wasn't because he was a worthless sinner – he was just a proud man looking to get more glory for himself

with this new thing Philip was preaching.

The thing that keeps most men out of Heaven is a wrong view of themselves. We have heard it for so long, that man is basically good – he just needs to fan the spark of his own goodness. And some believe they are so good that God just couldn't pass them by or send them to hell. Ask a man on the street if he has ever been saved, and he will start telling you about his goodness. "I go to church, I don't beat my wife, I provide for my family, I give to charity, I live a clean life, etc." And somehow they think that God is in Heaven applauding them for their exemplary life.

Simon doesn't know who he is. And it doesn't matter how many times he prayed or how sincere he was in wanting to have Christ. It doesn't matter if he truly believed what Philip was preaching. As long as he was convinced of his own greatness, he could never be saved.

2) An External View of Salvation!

Philip was given power to perform miracles during this transitional time, and his preaching and miracles were seeing great results. And probably some of the people who had been following Simon were now following Jesus. The preaching of Philip was more powerful than the sorcery of Simon, and Simon could see his following starting to dwindle. Simon had demonic power and had deceived the people for so long, but the Gospel threatened his game. But if he could add whatever Philip had to his own bag of tricks, then he would really be something. He saw a commodity in salvation: he was willing to confess Christ only for what he thought it would benefit him.

Preachers of the Gospel have to be careful not to preach the benefits of salvation without preaching the requirements of salvation. If I tell you about the blessings - the joy, peace. Heaven, eternal life - it is easy enough to get someone to commit to Who wouldn't want to go to Heaven? Who wouldn't want to have joy and peace? But you don't get saved for what you can get out of it. You get saved because you have violated the laws of God and are under condemnation and in danger of hell fire. The first point in most gospel presentations is: "God loves you and has a wonderful plan for your life." That is true, but it is not the foundational truth of the Gospel. The Gospel does not begin with God loves you. The Gospel begins with the law. And the law says you are under divine wrath. The first message isn't that God loves you, but that God hates your sin.

3) An Evasive View of Sin!

The apostles in Jerusalem heard of the revival in Samaria and decided to send Peter and John down to investigate it. When Peter arrived he was convinced that this was the same thing that had been happening at Jerusalem since Pentecost. So he prayed for the Holy Ghost to fall on these new believers, and they "received the Holy Ghost." Now, Simon was standing by when all this happened. He saw Peter lay hands on the believers, and he saw the Holy Ghost come upon them. And he thought in his wicked heart that if he had that power, he could really get a crowd (8:18-19).

8:20-23 — "Repent therefore of this thy wickedness." Peter saw right through him. Peter condemns the heart of Simon and tells him his only hope is to repent of his sin. He knows what he has been doing, the scam he has been playing, and just trying this new religion out wasn't going to help him. Peter speaks of his "gall of bitterness" and "bond of iniquity." He has no kind words for him – just tells him he is a dirty sinner and his only hope is to repent.

8:24 - "Pray ye the Lord for me, that none of these things which ye have spoken come upon me." Simon's response was to ask the preacher to pray for him that terrible things didn't happen to him. I think he even shed a tear when he said this. He probably had his head bowed, sad expression on his face, voice cracking, ... Buthe did not repent! He just asked that Peter pray for him that nothing bad would happen to him. There was no confession of his sin, no judgment of himself, no acknowledging his wicked ways, no godly sorrow. He didn't ask for forgiveness one time. He was scared, but he wasn't saved. He never faced his sin. He avoided the issue. He didn't want to talk about sin and repentance; he just wanted more power in his life and more miracles. He wanted a commodity, but he didn't want forgiveness. And Simon the sorcerer is in hell.
