With the political uncertainty, economic downturn, and moral decay so evident in our country, I rejoice that in the words of a great old song, "This world is not my home, I'm just a passing through. My treasures are laid up somewhere beyond the blue. The angels beckon me from Heaven's open door, And I can't feel at home in this world anymore."

It's very evident that the unsaved are "lovers of their own selves," and "lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God;" but the born again, Bible-believing, dedicated Christian has his/her sights fixed on Heaven's bright shore and refuses to live for this world alone.

Our lifestyle is probably a little odd to the younger generation, but regardless of how much the new U.S. president emphasizes change, we intend to continue with the same biblical principles and lifestyle that we have enjoyed for the past fortyeight years. When I first got saved, I smoked cigarettes. One little tract condemning the tobacco habit took that away. My wife wore pants and shorts. We learned that witnessing, tithing, and giving to missions was the right thing to do with our money. We sent our three children to a Christian school and Christian college, and that decision paid off big time.

We thought that a cat left free to roam the house at night might lick the salt shakers, nibble on the bread, or use the kitchen sink for a commode. The "clean dog," if not watched closely, would use his tongue for toilet paper, then kiss the baby right on the mouth. In view of these ideas, animals were not allowed inside the house, and the cat had to hunt mice for food, and the dog ate left over table scraps, if there were any. We lived by the philosophy that, "if any would not work, neither should he eat," and that if a dog wouldn't hunt, he didn't eat either.

I'm not suggesting that anyone live like I was raised, I am just telling how it was in my day. In fact, it appears that since I was young, in some instances some animals, even rodents, have gotten smarter than humans. The Print Shop

Dear Friends and Supporters,

Since our last newsletter, things certainly have been busy in the shops. I say shops because we have been in the process of moving for several months into our new building, but things really got busy in that regard in the last week or so. There is an old saying, "The best-laid plans of mice and men often go awry." The original plan was to finish binding all the Spanish Bibles we had printed in the old print shop so we would not have to move all the loose signatures. At first, things went well. We put a few thousand Bibles together with cover stock that we had foil stamped in Shelbyville, TN. We planned to do the rest of the foil stamping ourselves on our new to us letter-press. It took a little longer to get the cover stock than I had first anticipated, so that was a delay. Fortunately, it was not too difficult to learn how to run the letter press, and we had just started foil stamping the covers, when I realized the covers were not cut according to the specifications sent to the company that makes the cover stock. They have agreed to make it right by doing it over, but that is another three week delay. In light of that, and the fact that we were using some borrowed equipment to help us with the move, we decided to go ahead and move everything while we were waiting for the new cover stock to arrive. All the equipment and Bibles are now in the new print shop. The glue binder still has to be put back together, and there is a lot of organizing to do, so it looks like we will be busy for some time to come. Please pray that we get enough done before the new cover stock gets here so we can get back to putting these Bibles together as soon as possible.

Please pray that we can get one piece of equipment in particular running soon. It is a three knife trimmer that came with the bindery system we use to help collate the Bibles. It has never worked properly since we have had it. A company in Iowa can do an upgrade on it for over \$10,000. Some others have said they could repair it but have not had the time to do so yet. For now we use our single knife trimmer to trim the books, but this is very time consuming, since each book must be put into the cutter three times to finish the cuts. We will do it if need be, but it sure would be a blessing to have the three knife trimmer working properly so we can get these Bibles where they need to go as soon as pos-

In a few short years almost two thousand people came to Christ through his ministry-- when all doors seemed shut.

The Committed Christian

John 21:15-25

Of all the disciples, Thomas and Peter are the two we like to beat up on the most. Our nature is to belabor the faults of our brethren because it helps our own image, and these two disciples are the easiest to criticize. Especially Peter: he was always opening his mouth at the wrong time, was argumentative with the Lord, denied Christ in the hour of crisis, and returned to the fishing business after the crucifixion.

Peter probably deserves every sermon preached about him, but he wasn't always the Peter we so often hear about. In fact, the Peter in Acts and the epistles is very different than the Peter in the gospels. If all you knew about him came from the gospels, you would be amazed that it was this same Peter who had 3,000 conversions at Pentecost, stood fast even in prison, welcomed Gentiles into the church, and even bravely faced martyrdom. The scene in John 21 was a defining moment in his life: he was never the same Peter after his encounter with the risen Lord on the seashore. If we did not have this incident, we would never understand how Peter could go from warming his hands by the enemies' fire to preaching at Pentecost. This scene bridges the gap for us.

Peter's Failure was that, though he made great boast that he would never forsake the Lord (Luke 22:33, 34), he did deny the Lord even as the Lord was dying for him. Peter's Foolishness was assuming that his ministry was over and that it would be better to return to his old life. Yet Peter's Friend had not stopped loving him. Though he had failed the Lord miserably, he found that Jesus is the friend of the fallen. Peter's Future was

that he went on to follow the Lord, lead the church, and eventually glorified God through his death.

One of Peter's faults was that he thought he was stronger than he was. He boasted of his commitment to Christ – "Though all men shall be offended because of thee, yet will I never be offended" – but his commitment wasn't as strong as he boasted of. What does commitment really look like? After this encounter with Jesus, Peter began to demonstrate true Christian commitment.

His Work Was Compelled by Love!

(21:15-17) Three times Jesus challenged Peter's love for Him. The supreme issue was how much Peter loved the Lord. He did not ask him how much he would do for Him, but how much did he love Him. A truly committed Christian must serve God out of a heart of love. "For the love of Christ constraineth us" (2 Cor. 5:14). We don't serve Christ because we have to but because we want to. We can manipulate and browbeat people into holding to a standard, but love is a greater motivation. Peter had sworn that he loved the Lord more than the others, so Jesus challenged that. "Lovest thou me more than these?" Whether He was pointing to the boats and nets or to the other disciples, He wanted Peter to love Him more than anything in his life.

A word must be said here about the use of the two Greek words for love in this chapter:agape and phileo. Much "to do" has been made by Greek students about how agape is a deep, spiritual love while phileo is a casual, friendship style of love. Accordingly, we who can only read English are told that Jesus was asking Peter if he loved Him with agape love and that Peter replied that he loved the Lord with phileo love. Of course, if you don't know Greek you would miss that deep meaning of the text. The only problem with this deeper truth is that the NT uses both words interchangeably. John 3:35 says the Father loves the Son (agape), while John 5:20 says the Father loves the Son (phileo). John 3:16 says God loves the world (agape), while John 16:27 says the Father loves us (phileo). Ephesians 5:25 says husbands are to love their wives (agape), while Titus 2:4 says wives should love their husbands (phileo). So much for golden nuggets in the Greek!

His Way Was Committed to God!

(21:18-19) Peter had failed the Lord and had thought that surely the Lord would not have anything to do with him now. He had returned to the career he had left behind three years earlier, and I'm sure his heart was breaking. But the Lord came to him, and instead of chastening him, He loved him. Three times He commissioned Peter to, "Feed my sheep," meaning there was a ministry for him. Then the Lord tells Peter that he will end his ministry in death. Young men get called to preach and have visions of how grand the ministry is. They see a big church, nice office, salary, speaking engagements - but that is not what Jesus told Peter he was getting. He was getting a cross!

"This spake he, signifying by what death he should glorify God." He had failed in the hour of crisis once, but this time when he faces the greatest trial of his life, he will glorify God in it. He had put Jesus to shame just a few days earlier; but he would not fail the next time. In 64 A.D., Peter was imprisoned and put to death by Nero. Historians tell us that when they crucified Peter, he asked his crucifiers to crucify him upside down. He did not feel worthy to die the way his Lord had died.

In all of Christian martyrdom, there is not a story of greater courage in the face of death than that of Peter. You will know you are truly committed to God when you can say goodbye to everything in your life that matters to you for Christ. You won't know where your commitment is until it costs you something – but then you'll know.

His Will Was Content With Following!

(21:19-23) "Follow me," Some people think the Christian life is complicated, but this is about as simple as it gets. You don't have to be in the lead; you don't have to be recognized; you don't have to make a name for yourself – you just need to follow. Everywhere you go, if you should be asked, "Why are you here?" you should be able to say, "I'm following Jesus, and this is where He's led me today." That means the places you go, the words you say, the things you do, the relationships you build, are all founded on the fact that you're following Jesus, and He has brought you to that place.
