The Print Shop

Dear Friends and Supporters,

Another year has come and gone, and upon reflection, it has been a good year. For years we printed only John/Romans in various languages. When the Lord allowed us to upgrade to our present press, we started doing New Testaments as well. Then a few years ago we finally started printing whole Bibles in Spanish. It seems that this is the item which has the greatest demand lately. We recently finished collating and binding a truckload of Bibles that went mainly to the border town of Juarez, Mexico, where there has been so much drug violence in the last few years. It is my hope and prayer that these Bibles will

change many lives and ultimately bring relative peace to that area. If it does happen, you will never know why from the evening news. Some politician will no doubt get the credit. If it never happens, we already know that many individual lives have been changed through the word of God and the work of some brave souls in that area. Please join many others that are praying and working for peace and safety in that region.

Our next project, which we have already started printing, is another truckload of Bibles that will go to Guatemala and be distributed among several missionaries there. We plan to do the collating a little different this time in hopes that it will not only speed up the process, but have less waste. We are constantly learning how to do things better, for which I thank God. This, at least, makes some of the trials worth it. One of the challenges of this project is that we will not be able to ship it a pallet or two at a time, but it will have to go into a container all at once, meaning that it will have to be juggled around several times to make room for all of it in the print shop. Pray that God gives us wisdom with that so we can operate as efficiently as possible.

Somewhere in the middle of this pro-

ject, we are expecting to get another truck-load of paper to print into Telegu John/Romans. Bro Keith Davidson and his crew at Seedline International in Indiana, will be putting those together and shipping them to India. Beyond that, we are just waiting to see what the Lord provides and where He leads. We have some suggestions as to how we think God should do some things, but we will just have to wait and follow His direction.

Many people this year will be putting emphasis on the 400th anniversary of the translation of the King James Bible. I think the best way to celebrate that anniversary is to read it, take it to heart, and obey it as much as possible. What is the use of praising its accuracy and poetic beauty if we neglect to read it and continue in sin? If you have read it, and it has done something for your heart, would you please consider helping us to print it, and other foreign translations, so that others might know the mind of God as well? I can think of no better way to honor the Book that has transformed so many countless lives.

Who Wears The Pants In Your Family?

The following article came from a Roane County, West Virginia newspaper on December 20, 2010.

In West Virginia, nothing changed as much in the 1920's as opportunities for women. More women than ever before worked outside the home, attended school, and started professional careers.

Teacher Fannie Cobb Carter of Charleston, became the first black newspaperwoman in West Virginia and a leader in the fight against illiteracy.

In 1922, two years after women received the right to vote, Izetta Jewel Brown, an actress and suffragette from Kingwood, became the first woman in the South to run for the United States Senate.

In 1923, a fourteen-y ear-old girl in Roane County was arrested for wearing pants. It was in violation of a local law banning females from dressing in "anything that impersonates males attire." The next day, she and three girlfriends paraded through Reedy in forbidden clothing. Not long after, the issue of "pants or no pants" dominated Reedy's next election. Politicians and church members fought hard to maintain the ordinance, with the voters deciding women could wear pants.

Theoretically, following the election, "women could wear the pants in the family."

MY KING JAMES BIBLE

2 Timothy 3:14-15

This y ear (2011) many churches will commemorate the 400-y ear anniversary of the translation of the 1611 Authorized Version of the Bible. We believe that the holy Scriptures were inspired of God and were providentially preserved throughout centuries, and that the crown jewel of preservation is the 1611 AV. We believe that, as it is the same words of the original writings in a different language and that it contains all the properties of the originals (inerrancy, infallibility), it is proper to call the AV the inspired Word of God.

We do not believe the archaic words should be rewritten, the italicized words replaced, or the offensive words removed. We believe that, as God saw fit to preserve His pure Word in English, we do not need to go back to the Greek to see what He meant to say. Our "narrow-minded" view is that if you have a King James Bible, you have the divinely inspired, perfectly preserved Word of God.

The apostle Paul, as an aged preacher, wrote two letters to young Timothy, and he gave him much advice concerning his treatment of the Scriptures (2 Tim. 2:9,15; 3:15-17; 4:13).

1) The Bible is a Sacred Book!

"And that from a child thou hast known the <u>holy</u> scriptures,..." This Bible is not just another book. It is a heavenly volume, a sacred library, a holy book. Bible-believers are sometimes accused of worshipping King James over King Jesus: we don't worship the Bible, but we should have great respect for the book. The Bible is a book that should be handled with care; it is disrespectful to place another book on top of the

Bible because the Bible is the monarch of books.

2) The Bible is a Special Book!

"And that from a child thou hast known the holy <u>scriptures</u>,..." That is an unusual word and it reminds us that the Bible is a very special book. It holds a distinctive title and even has a distinctive look. If someone walks into a public place carrying a Bible, everyone recognizes that book. It feels different, it looks different, and you even carry it differently than other books.

The Bible is not a **history book**, but when it touches on history it does so without error. There are absolutely no historical errors in the Bible, something which cannot be said about many, if any, books of history. The Bible is not a **science book**, but when the Bible touches on a scientific subject, it does so without error. The Bible is not a **psychology book**, but when it speaks on psychological matters it is accurate. The Bible tells us what man is, a body, soul, and spirit, and that man's greatest need is salvation from sin.

The Bible is a **book of principles** for us to live by: "...be ye kind one to another,...forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you." The Bible is a **book of promises** for us to rest in: "Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you." Standing on the Promises is more than a song; it can be a reality. The Bible is a **book of prophecies** for us to believe in. The Bible is the only book that attempts to make prophecy because the danger of prophecy is that if you make a prediction, and then it doesn't come to pass, you are discredited.

3) The Bible is a Salvation Book!

"Which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus." The Bible has a specific intention and purpose: that people like you and me might read its message and be saved and go to heaven when we die. "But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through His name" (John 20:31).

It is the Bible that tells us that we are all sinners: "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." "... There is none righteous, no, not one." It is the Bible that tells us that the debt of sin must be paid. "For the wages of sin is death;"... "...it is appointed unto men once to die..." It is the

Bible that tells us that Jesus has already paid the price for our sins: "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners. Christ died for us." It is the Bible that tells us that if we will trust in Christ we can be saved and have our sins forgiven: "For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." "But as many as received him to them gave he power to become the sons of God. even to them that believe on his name." It is the Bible that tells us that God will give us eternal life if we just believe on His Son: "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

I cut the outline short in this issue to give a personal challenge to every one who reads this page to make 2011 the year of the Bible. If you have never read your Bible all the way through or if you have let if fall by the way side, this is the year to again make it a part of your daily life. Almost every one reading this will eat, at least, one meal a day for the next 365 days, so why not feast daily on the Word of God? As Christians, we are to do five things with our Bible: Read (Isa. 34:16), Study (2 Tim. 2:15), Meditate (Josh. 1:8), Memorize (Ps. 119:11), and Apply (Deut. 7:11).

To be consistent you must have a **Set Plan**. I don't think it is ever good to have a day without a schedule. When you get up in the morning you should already have mapped out how you are going to spend that day. Time is too precious and short to waste sitting around wondering what to do next. Make an appointment with God.

The random finger method is a poor way to read your Bible. There are a number of good plans to take you through the Bible in a month or a year, it doesn't matter which plan you choose, just so you systematically read the Scriptures.

Then you must have a **Set Place**. Get away from distractions—turn the TV off, get rid of background noise, and concentrate on what you're reading. For years, I have read my Bible to the reading of Alexander Scourby because it slows me down and helps me to focus my mind on the words.

Finally, have a **Set Time**. It is my contention that the early morning (Ps. 63:1) is the best time to meet with God, but if midnight is best for you, then God will meet you then. But you must schedule that time and be jealous of it or else a thousand things will insist they are more urgent, and you will go throughout your days with no time for your Bible.
