Keep The Church Pure

1 Corinthians 5

The apostle Paul dealt with in-house problems (division within the body and seducement of worldly philosophies) in 1 Corinthians 1-4, but then moved in chapters 5-6 to problems that were being practiced publicly and which had damaged the church's testimony in Corinth. These problems were 1) they neglected to discipline a known fornicator in their midst and 2) they were suing each other over petty differences. It was his concern that the church be pure within, but also have a good reputation without. It was not just what the sin did to the body, but it also bothered him how the public knowledge of those sins slandered the name of Christ.

The world is already suspicious of the church. They don't agree with our doctrine, don't understand our philosophy of life, and don't like how we live. They believe that we should be different but then mock us for those differences. And most people believe the church is full of either hypocrites or nut cases, and they are ready to pounce on the first double-standard or duplicity they see. Sadly, the church too often gives them all the ammunition they need. If the church were to be more diligent in judging itself and keeping itself pure, then it would be more plausible to persuade the world of our reality. So, the Apostle Paul addresses not just a problem in the church, but the fact that it was not being handled properly.

1) The Sinful Action of a Brother!

One of the defining 5:1 characteristics of our culture is an obsession with immoral living and sexual perversion. Advertising, movies, television, and modern music are all saturated with sexual overtures. Every imaginable

matters. There is no shame in vulgarities because we have developed a barnyard mentality. Wicked men do things even animals won't do - you've never seen a queer dog, have you?

It is a challenge for the Christian to stay pure in this X-rated world. Even if we keep our bodies pure, it is a battle to keep our minds pure. We are commanded to "flee fornication" (1 Cor. 6:18), "keep thyself pure" (1 Tim. 5:22), and to not "company with fornicators" (1 Cor. 5:9). But a member in Corinth was openly living in fornication, and the worst thing was that everyone knew about it but no one was bothered by it. And it was such a case of fornication that even the lost pagans didn't practice (5:1). It is bad when the sin of the world doesn't shock the church; it is worse when the sin of the church does shock the world.

2) The Shameful Attitude of the Church!

5:2 - The greater sin in the chapter was not the member committing fornication, but the membership tolerating it. Paul speaks of the fornicator, but he does not address the fornicator directly nor does he threaten to deal with him when he comes back to Corinth. This was the duty of the church, yet they had been negligent to address the sin and to guard the purity of the body.

All across America Baptist churches are dying, and much of the decline could be because we have tolerated sin in our midst for too long. Sin will kill a church guicker than anything else, and when sin runs rampant through a congregation, it will rot from the inside out. The greatest mistake Baptists have ever made was when they began emphasizing church growth over church purity. The Gospel was watered down and repentance explained away resulting in filling church pews with goodlooking, lost people. They were never told that their sin was wicked before they got saved, and if you told them now they would leave the church, taking their precious tithe with them.

Lack of church discipline is marked by moral decline of its members and a shallow commitment to the Scriptures. Church discipline is never pleasant, but it is vital to the purity, power, progress, and purpose of the church. In Matthew 18:15-18, the first address to the church was on the subject of church discipline. The first instruction was not about singing or soul-winning, but about sin in the body. Jesus was concerned immoral practice is flaunted publicly and we about the purity of the church. In Acts 5, the

have become desensitized to sexual first thing that happened in the church after Pentecost was church discipline. Lying members were struck down dead and the result was that, "great fear came upon all the church" (Acts 5:11). In Revelation 2:18-20, the church at Thyatira had many commendable things, but their fault was that they allowed a Jezebel in the church to teach false doctrine and promote sinful living. Jesus' complaint against the church was that they tolerated Jezebel.

3) The Solemn Appeal of the Apostle!

5:3-13 - The remainder of the chapter is Paul's exhortation to the church to take care of this matter. The process begins with the church being "gathered together." This is to be a corporate action - the entire church meets and takes action. Paul would not deal with this member; this was something the church needed to do. The authority to exercise church discipline is in the congregation.

Matthew 18 gives us the pattern for church discipline, and excommunication is the last step. The goal of church discipline is not to get rid of trouble making members but to restore sinning members. But when the sinning brothers will not heed the authority and counsel of church leaders. and ultimately the church body, they are to be put out of the church. The purity and health of the body cannot be sacrificed for the toleration of one member's sin. If you had a foot that had gangrene and it was spreading up your leg and farther up your body, you would not sacrifice your body for the sake of that diseased leg. You would hate to have it amputated, but you would rather do that than allow the disease to spread and to eventually cause your death. The amoutation of a member is never pleasant, but we would rather cast out the immoral member than to have sin spread throughout the body of the church.

Verse 5 has to be one of the most sobering verses in the Bible. The ultimate act of church discipline is to put someone out of the church - not to sue them, not to take them to court, not to spread the word about their sin. The worst thing that can happen to them is to cast them out. There is an umbrella of protection in the church, and when someone is cast out, they are removed from that protection. The world is the domain of Satan, and you need a church to help you stay pure and right and holy. And when you remove yourself, or are removed from the church, you are at the mercy of Satan.
